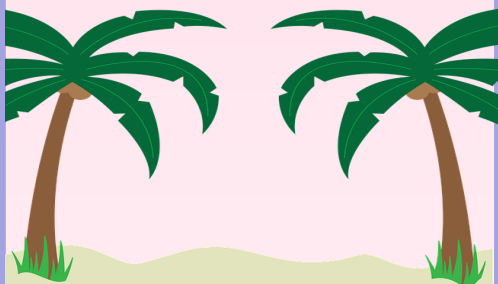

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The mission of Upward Bound at Mineral Area College is to serve eligible high school students by providing academic enrichment, cultural experiences, and a support network to ensure their success in attaining a four year college degree.

A Federally Funded Program

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound I program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,757,932 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. The indirect cost rate agreement is 8% of which 25% is returned to support the program.

The Mineral Area College Upward Bound II program is a TRIO program funded with a five-year, \$1,531,715 grant from the U.S. Department of Education. This represents 100% of the program cost. The indirect cost rate agreement is 8% of which 25% is returned to support the program.

Upward Bound is one of five programs established by Congress to help low-income, first-generation students enter college and graduate. These programs are referred to as the TRIO programs.
