

Then Department of Revenue (DOR) will notify you by mail when your plates are available for pick-up at your local license contract office. You may order CTF plates at any time regardless of your current license plate expiration date. DOR will either exchange the new CTF plates for your surrendered plates or pro-rate your fees. In St. Francois County, donations go to St. Francois County Partnership to help fund programs such as Mentoring, Youth Suicide Prevention, and Project Sunlight. 
